

CINCE OUR LAST newsletter we have had two Dexcellent meetings. At our second in January, we had our annual meeting with our Royal Ballet School Association Award winners, Victoria Norris from Australia, Davi Ramos from Brazil and Gearoid Solan from Ireland. Victoria and Davi are now in their second year and Gearoid in his graduate year. They were escorted by former English National Ballet Lead Principal Daria Klimentová, who now teaches second year Upper School students. They gave us a very entertaining evening describing their training in their respective home countries, their time at the Royal Ballet School and, in Daria's case, talking about her illustrious career as a Principal Dancer. Daria also spoke about the Prague International Ballet Masterclasses, which she has directed since 2003. Davi had attended last summer and spoke enthusiastically about his experiences there, which he hopes to repeat this year. It is always a pleasure to meet our award winners and look forward to following their careers. Gearoid is currently auditioning for companies in Europe and had an audition with Zurich Ballet a few days after the talk.

At our February meeting, on Valentine's Day, we were delighted to welcome Royal Ballet Principal, Sarah Lamb. Perched on stools, so the audience could see us in the Forum Hall, Sarah gave us an entertaining account of aspects of her career. Talking initially of the experience of working with Twyla Tharp on the new pas de deux for An Illustrated 'Farewell', Sarah spoke of other work this season and her injury at the end of last season before moving on to talk about her collaboration with Wayne McGregor and other aspects of her career. This included speaking about the film (Dreams of Giverny) that had been made of her in Monet's garden in Giverny. Those present indicated that the acoustic in this hall is good and they heard everything. The capacity isn't as great, but we will look to book this room for some meetings next season.

## **Future meetings**

We are delighted to welcome newly promoted Principal Yasmine Naghdi as our guest on Thursday 22 March. We had asked her immediately after her promotion but Yasmine felt it more appropriate to talk after her performances as *Giselle*. Born in London of Belgian and Iranian parents, Yasmine last spoke to the Association in 2011. She graduated into The Royal Ballet in 2010 from The Royal Ballet School, where in 2009 she won the Young British Dancer of the Year Competition. During her time at the School she took part in an exchange programme with the Vaganova Academy in St Petersburg.

Her roles in The Royal Ballet have included Juliet, Sugar Plum Fairy, Aurora, Olga in *Onegin* and The Girl in *The Invitation*. As well as making her debut as Giselle this season, she will also dance Lescaut's Mistress in *Manon*. Yasmine is a keen musician, singing, playing the piano and composing and we can expect her to give us a very entertaining evening.

The following month, on Thursday 12 April, we are very pleased to welcome our Patron, Royal Ballet Director **Kevin O'Hare** as our guest. Since becoming Director, Kevin has followed the precedent set by his predecessor and has come to talk to us every other season. As previously, Kevin will look back over this and last season and look forward to the new *Swan Lake* and the plans for next season, as well as talking about changes in the Company that he has introduced and other plans for the future. We can expect, as always, a very interesting meeting. We are very grateful to Kevin for the support he has given the Association since becoming Director, in particular for inviting us to a rehearsal or class each year. We can expect a very interesting evening.

Provisional dates for meetings are: Thursday 10 May, Thursday 24 May, Thursday 7 June. Please note

that the meeting scheduled for Thursday 10 May and Friday 20 April have been cancelled as they clash with other Royal Ballet related events.

Meetings begin at 7.30 p.m. and are at Bloomsbury Central Baptist Church which is at the eastern end of Shaftesbury Avenue, opposite the Shaftesbury Theatre. From Covent Garden, walk up Endell Street, cross over Shaftesbury Avenue and walk past the opticians. Doors open at 6.45 p.m. unless otherwise stated. Entrance is £4 for members, £3 for concessions, £8 for guests.

#### News

Members will have heard recently, that Birmingham Royal Ballet has announced that **David Bintley** is stepping down as its Director at the end of next season after 24 years. He first joined as a boy 42 years ago and has choreographed more than 22 works for the Company including 10 full length works. He plans to pursue increasing requests to choreograph new works and to stage his ballets. We hope to invite David to talk to us during next season.

Many members will have been present for the performance of *Giselle* on Thursday 1 February, which celebrated **Marianela Nuñez's** 20th season with the Company. It was a very special evening, with a massive flower throw and a tribute from Company Director Kevin O'Hare.



In the last newsletter, we announced the death of long-standing member Violetta Hannington. Around 20 Association members attended her Funeral in January, with members of her family and her Italian friends. (See above, with her favourite dancer, Jonathan Cope) Jonathan is currently on a year's sabbatical from the Company and is not in London, but sent a message, concluding "She was a special lady who will be thought of often." The following week, Kevin O'Hare came on stage before the General Rehearsal of *Giselle* and spoke about Violetta and dedicated the performance

to her memory.

On a happier note, on the 10th February, our longterm Membership Secretary and founder member Joan Seaman celebrated her 95th birthday. We sent flowers to Joan to mark this special birthday. Whilst she is unable to attend meetings any longer, Joan still manages to come to some Royal Ballet performances and is always pleased to greet members. ## The Royal Ballet in class

Once again, we have arranged a visit to the Upper School in Floral Street to watch three classes. This is a joint visit with London Ballet Circle and initially will only be open to members of the BA or LBC.

If you have no e-mail address, please enclose a stamped addressed envelope. All monies collected will be donated to The Royal Ballet School to provide additional funds for students. Please apply before 15th April. If you would like to bring a guest, at a cost of £20, please indicate this in your letter, but do not include them in your cheque. We will contact you after 15 April to confirm whether or not any guest places are available.

We will not be issuing tickets. Places will be confirmed by email (or post). Your name will be placed on a list, which will be held at the door. If a 9 am start is too early for you, it will be possible to join us at morning break around 10.30am. Please indicate in your letter if you will be a late arrival. There will be a one hour lunch break before the afternoon session. The School politely requests that you leave the premises during this break as they do not have the space to allow you to eat lunch on site. However, if you have any mobility issues, please indicate this in your letter and provision will be made for you to stay on site during the break and seating will be reserved for you in the theatre.

Many members managed to attend this season's performances of Draft Works in January which took place in the Royal Ballet School. As usual, the Association contributed towards these performances. Kevin O'Hare wrote:

#### Critics' Circle National Dance Awards

Once again, the Ballet Association sponsored the National Dance Award for Best Classical Choreography. In the absence of our Chairman, who was en route to Havana, Committee member and former Deputy Chairman Chris Scott presented the award to Akram Khan for Akram Khan's *Giselle* for English National Ballet.

Other winners included Zenaida Yanowsky as Best Female Dancer, Marcelino Sambé as Colas in *La Fille mal gardée* for Outstanding Male Performance

(Classical) and Alina Cojocaru for Outstanding Female Performance (Classical) as Giselle in Akram Khan's Giselle.
